A team of year 7 and 8 girls played against three other schools at dodgeball on Friday afternoon. They all played extremely well and were very competitive. Well done to everyone that played.



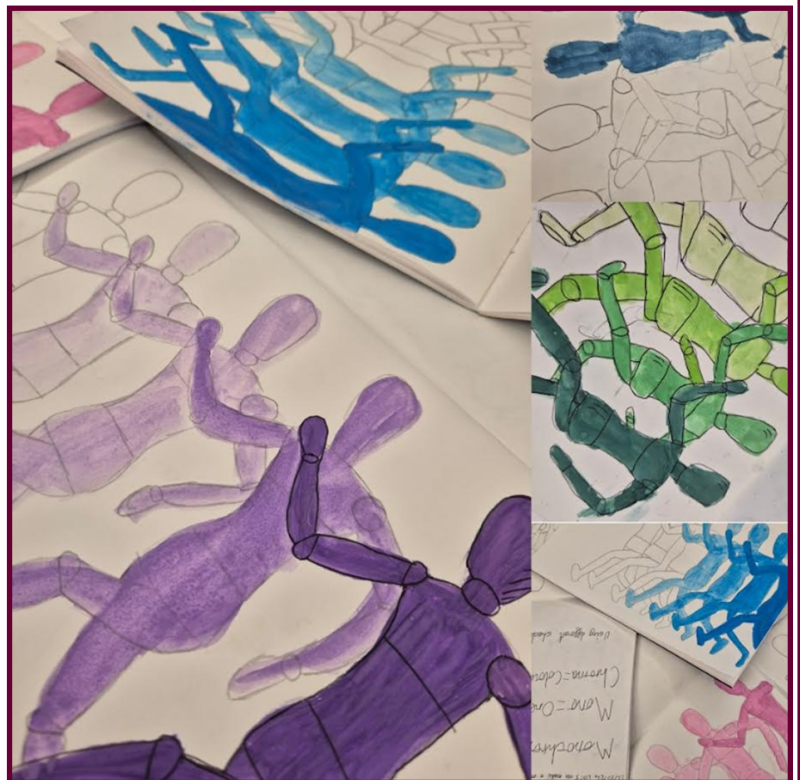
KS3 Food Technology

Yesterday the U13 Girls' Football Team played Allenbourn Middle School in the County Cup. It was an amazing match that demonstrated the determination and resilience of the whole team.

After a mix-up in defence, and a really good passage of play by Allenbourn, Emmanuel fell behind 2-0 after 10 minutes. However, they were not to be chastened. Maintaining their pressure, Emmanuel continued to dominate the midfield and look for a foothold in the game. This arrived just before half-time with a superb curling shot, into the top corner, from Zoe.

Emmanuel continued to press in the second half with Imiya running towards goal on numerous occasions. She was rewarded, with a great strike, to level the game at 2-2. With the minutes ticking away, the best goal this season was scored.
