SATS (Standard Assessment Tests) measure children's educational achievement in years 2 and 6, with the ultimate aim of holding schools to account for the attainment of their pupils and the progress they make.

How are they marked?

Scores are given on a scale of 80 to 120 - with a score of 100 or more meaning a pupil is meeting the expected governmental standard (but this equates to different marks for each paper). Key Stage 2 Sats are sent away to be marked externally.

Do parents get the results? For key stage 2, parents get their child's scaled score in July and are told whether or not they reached the expected level. The results of Key stage 2 Sats are also published annually in the Department of Education's primary school league tables, where an online facility enables users to compare schools against other schools, as well as against the national average.

Can you fail? The government says SATS are not about passing or failing, but instead show the level your child is working to.

Provision - for those who require it

1. Reader - if their reading age is below their actual age and they are supported with reading as normal classroom practice
2. Extra time - if they meet the criteria linked to reading speed, processing speed, teacher judgement and this is normal classroom practice. It is applied for.
3. Scribe - if a child is unable to write legible answers
4. Transcribe - if a child needs some support with handwriting to ensure their answers are legible

6 Illness or injury at the time of the tests

Schools should not administer a test to a pupil who is ill. If a pupil is not fit to take the test, the school should consider applying for a [timetable variation](#)⁹ for permission to administer the test on another day. Pupils who were ill while taking a test will not qualify for special consideration.

If a pupil becomes ill during a test, the school should stop the test and make a note of the time. The pupil can be given a supervised rest break in school and can continue the test with the remaining amount of time when they are feeling better. If the pupil is not able to continue, or is sent home, the partially completed test script must be sent for marking. If the pupil leaves the school premises, they will have left test conditions and must not be allowed to continue or restart the test when they return to school.

If the pupil sustains an injury to their hand or wrist, that impacts their ability to take the tests, they may use a scribe. If the injury occurred within one week of the tests, the school may also allow up to 25% additional time because the pupil is unfamiliar working with a scribe. In these situations, an application for additional time is not required, but the school should be prepared to explain their arrangements in case of a monitoring visit. If the pupil is already familiar working with a scribe, additional time must not be given. The scribe must follow the guidance in section 4.1 and the school must submit a notification form on the [Primary Assessment Gateway](#).

How to support

1. Homework - linked to curriculum and SATS questions
2. Reading - ensure reading is taking place and use of Accelerated Reader for quizzing of books happens after each book is finished
3. Mock SATS - review the practice papers when they get sent home for areas to work on
4. Being a reader or support during SATS week - please leave your name, child's name and email address for us to contact you if you can support us on the Jan Mock SATS or SATS in May on any morning. There will be a compulsory briefing prior to attend.
