

Emmanuel Middle School Start Up Success Skills Builder day Years 5,6 and 7

We are delighted to announce that Emmanuel Middle School has been awarded the Silver Award by Skills Builder. We have had a really successful year using Skills Builder to enhance our personal development work using the essential life skills and hope to continue this next year.



In the autumn term, every year group was involved in the "Operation Moonbase" day, which we all enjoyed, but the feedback from staff and pupils was that Friday's "Start-Up-Success" day was even better!

Over the course of the challenge, learners apply Steps 4-6 in all eight essential skills as they consider: How do you set up your own business? They explore the world of entrepreneurship by setting up their own start-up designing, making and selling a range of souvenirs to show off the best aspects of their local community.

Listening Speaking Problem Solving Creativity Staying Positive Aiming High Leadership Teamwork

The pupils worked in small teams to achieve their goals of designing and producing souvenirs for the local area. This initially involved researching the New Forest, the beaches or the Jurassic coast. They then had to discuss and agree on their themes. Teamwork, creativity, positivity and aiming high were skills which were developed as the tasks progressed.

Year 5 made fridge magnets, postcards and bookmarks. Year 6 made postcards and badges using our new badge maker machine. Year 7 were given a more challenging task of creating a range of souvenirs: postcards, bags, keyrings and bunting. All year groups produced an excellent standard of products. The other stipulation for year 7 was that each type of souvenir had to be identical from each team and as you can see from the photos, they rose to that challenge too!

In the afternoon, the teams then had to pitch their ideas to the rest of the class who voted on the best designs. From their pitches, I am sure that we will see some of our pupils on Dragon's Den in the future- they were very persuasive. The last task was to reflect on the day and the skills that had been used.


And Finally
