



Dear Parents/Carers,





Although there was some disappointment that real aliens didn't turn up to school, pupils did a fantastic job welcoming them to Earth!



KS3 also applied all eight essential skills as they considered the question: **What makes a successful business?** They researched, developed, figured out cost, appropriate market and pitched their ideas for a new brand of chocolate. There was a big focus on the speaking and listening skills as each group presented to their class/year group and took a vote on the best brand of chocolate. Staff were blown away by the ideas presented. Mr Shooter even said that some of them should apply for the show The Apprentice!
