

Dear Parents/Carers,

Good afternoon and welcome to this week's parent bulletin.

You will be aware of the success of the Epraise shop to reward the endeavours of our pupils and the significant financial commitment from the PTFA. The school ethos is fundamentally about catching children doing the things we ask them to do. Feedback from pupils and staff back this and visitors often remark about the atmosphere in school.

Pupils will make mistakes from time to time and this is addressed through a warning system that typically does not escalate past a C2. However, I have taken the decision, from 1st May, to make C2 a bigger deterrent as there has been an increase in the frequency of pupils regularly attending a 25 minute lunch detention. Across a calendar month pupils can accrue three lunchtime detentions for a C2. Thereafter, the 4th C2 onwards will require the pupil to attend an after school detention that will finish at 4.30pm. Staff will call home to arrange which evening, within a 48 hour window, pupils will stay for this detention. All pupils deserve a disruption free learning environment and low level behaviours can be the most disruptive for our pupils. As a parent, you are able to track lunchtime detentions, in fact you can track all candle credits etc, on Epraise and encourage your child to avoid being kept after school. This can make things particularly difficult if you have an after school or evening engagement or other children to collect etc.

The Trust, working with Headteachers, have made an addendum to the Trust level Behaviour Policy which focuses mainly on the law. We have the facility to scan children who may have made an error in judgement by bringing a vape into school. This is a national issue and is frequently in the news. In more extreme circumstances this has resulted in toilets being closed and children being restricted in accessing toilets. We do not have any restrictions in place but have dealt with vapes being brought into school and, in some cases, being used. This has been dealt with under our school level behaviour policy. We have purchased a 'wand' to screen pupils which is not invasive and does not require contact. This will be conducted exclusively by myself and Mrs Robertson, depending on gender, in our roles as DSLs. In time we will also train Year Leaders and the Senior Team. I must emphasise this is in place to act as a deterrent rather than become a normal, regular routine and will be used only where we have significant reason to believe a child is either carrying a vape or has been vaping.

It is however very important that pupils attend school all week unless they are too ill to complete the tests. Any missed tests will be caught up before they have contact with peers and as such this could impact a child's involvement in the planned activity week. If you have any concerns about your child being able to attend please contact the school at the earliest opportunity so any reasonable adjustments can be made.
