As curriculum lessons already cover strategies to deal with bullying behaviours, we choose to focus on the positives of relationships and how acts of kindness can impact everyone around us instead.

Throughout the week, we have been encouraging the use of positive language towards each other as well as sending secret messages on compliment slips. Random acts of kindness will also sporadically happen!

Year 5/Year 8 Buddy Programme Update

Following their initial 'Ice-Breaker' Buddying Session, the Year 5 and Year 8 pupils have this week continued to develop their supportive friendships. The Buddying sessions play an important role in a middle school as they familiarise our younger pupils with their somewhat daunting, older counterparts.

Wednesday saw our first 'Show and Tell Buddy Session'. The Year 8 pupils brought in a range of interesting and personal items to show their younger buddies. These ranged from a radio controlled model tank to a pair of boxing gloves. The Year 8 children were asked to explain their items' significance and 'back-story' to their buddies and this proved to be a great success.

It was gratifying to see just how maturely our Year 8 pupils took to this task & to see them taking turns - demonstrating and explaining their objects to their recently acquired buddies.

In the evening several emails were exchanged between delighted staff who were supervising the buddying.
